HOT Training Sydney 2010

Here's my reflections on the recent HOT training in Sydney, attended by our illustrious leader Lucy (Little Miss Positive – see below), Secretary Lynn, Head Road Captain Diesel, Membership Officer Denis and myself as Treasurer(plus 2 partners who paid their own way).

Most of us traveled over on Thursday as the workshops started first thing Friday , so.... after finding our rooms at the hotel (I shared with Diesel after losing the toss with Denis!) we all went shopping with Lucy (I don't think she wanted us along but what else were we going to do on a wet afternoon in Sydney.) That lasted about an hour before we'd had enough and decided it was time for a drink. Dinner that evening was in some Chinese joint where Murray wanted crab, but that was too expensive so it was dodgy pork and chicken instead.

Friday started off with the Harley Australia team explaining why they were told to butt out of NZ rallies in future and why they had scored a few own goals over the last 12 months. Seemed like they were apologizing for being there...A yank called Schooner (or something like that) enlightened us on latest US developments (even mentioned that HD were looking at a 250cc model for learning, but I don't think so..) before we all went off to workshops. There were sessions about the ins and outs of running a chapter, brainstorming on promoting activities, road captain responsibilities, enhancing rider relationships, risk management etc. These were led by enthusiastic tutors (the Canberra Director, a full on sheila leading the charge) who tried to get everyone involved, to varying degrees of success. The HOG uniform (Harley everything and a leather vest with multiple badges and pins) on guys with huge pot bellies and some "butch" looking women was very much in evidence, except for the Wellington crew (we were doing our own mini revolt I think).

The group sessions were interesting....some Ladies of Harley got up to say they weren't being listened to in their chapters, there was some fiery debate about whether non Harleys were allowed on HOG National rallies, and as usual there were some right twats who could only hear their own voice (Aussies!!). The Saturday night dinner put on by HD Australia was held in their office basement and the "secret tour" was of the office and workshop – pretty lame compared to other HOT sessions I've heard. Deisel, Denis and Lynn all got caricatures done so ask to see them sometime – rather hilarious!! As the band was not much cop, I think most people left on the 11pm bus.

Sunday we went tiki touring – out to Paramatta to shop at the Motorcycle outlet (a 20 minute train ride followed by a 5 minute!! (yeah right Murray – more like 5 km) walk, then back on the ferry to Circular Quay (Lucy and Lynn were seen fraternizing with the local abos) then a bus trip to Bondi beach (wet again so no beach babes) followed by a train trip back to the hotel (we made full use of the \$20 day pass though).
